2 The Doctoral School of Public Administration

2.1 Key changes in 2020

No organisational changes were made in 2020.

Regarding the **composition of doctoral students**, it should be noted that

- In 2020, there were no applicants from Sapientia Hungarian University of Transylvania, so no new class was started in Cluj;
- the number of doctoral students admitted under the Stipendium Hungaricum scholarship programme decreased for administrative reasons.

In 2020, **45 new research topics** have been adopted, including those proposed by researchers from the Eötvös József Research Centre and the Faculty of Water Sciences.

We consider it an important and forward-looking innovation that in 2020 KDI for the first time **announced a scholarship competition** for doctoral students, the explicit aim of which was to provide financial support for high-quality publications and conference participation.

2.2 KDI events, events

Due to the epidemic 2020 events planned for 2020 have been cancelled. events to highlight:

- complex exams (January and June 2020), during which a total of 20 second-year doctoral student gave a demonstration of her knowledge
- the July 2020 online research forum (by research area)
- the online complex exam preparation for December 2020

2.3 Terms of operation of the KDI

From an operational point of view, it should be highlighted that the MAB accredited the KDI until 31 October 2023 by Decision 2018/9/VII/8/2/1226.

The KDI is technically operational. The KDI is integrated into the infrastructure system of the NUAS. The KDI website is constantly updated, providing sufficient information for doctoral students; at the same time, Neptune is the primary form of communication with doctoral students. The epidemic situation has also forced the KDI to move to online meetings, teaching and examinations, and online voting. The former was done through MS Teams and the latter through the Decision Support System. Overall, the online platforms worked smoothly and the administrative burden was significantly reduced.

The development of human resources is still justified, as the new doctoral organisational structure has significantly increased the tasks of the individual doctoral schools.

3 Future tasks of the Doctoral School of Public Administration

- a) encouraging high-quality publications and conference participation by doctoral students (the continuation of the publication grant launched in 2020)
- b) more intensive promotion of education at Sapientia University of Transylvania to ensure that we have Transylvanian doctoral students in 2021
- c) improving the electronic/online operational conditions of the TDT, relying on the University Decision Support System
- d) more emphasis on the training requirements; better monitoring of the academic progress of doctoral students
- e) to further develop the KDI's research and education portfolio in line with the priority of public science education

- f) expanding KDI's national and international contacts
- g) to strengthen the international character of English language training , to promote it within the national framework
