1 Statistical data

1.3 Number of workshops held

In 2022, 11 doctoral workshops were held, 3 of which were in English and 2 of which were for doctoral students in Cluj-Napoca. One workshop was unsuccessful - the number of participants was insufficient. The workshop was successfully held after a new date was set.

1.5 Termination of student status

In 2022, a total of 19 doctoral students' student status was terminated:

- 2 people have taken the initiative to transfer to another doctoral school,
- 1 person deceased,
- For 3 people, the deadline for starting the degree procedure has expired,
- 5 students have been terminated for failure to fulfil their training obligations meg,
- 7 people have initiated the termination of their student status at their own request,
- 1 person failed a complex exam and had their student status terminated as a result.

The KDI employs 27 lecturers and 96 subject writers and supervisors; about 90% of them work in the belong to the staff of the University.

2 The Doctoral School of Public Administration

2.1 Key changes in 2022

No organisational changes have been made in 2022.

Regarding the **composition of doctoral students**, it should be noted that

- There were no applicants from Sapientia Hungarian University of Transylvania in 2022, so for the third year in a row, no new class was started in the framework of the Cluj University;
- the number of PhD students admitted under the Stipendium Hungaricum fell due to a reduction in the quota of sending countries. Some of the doctoral students proposed for admission also started their doctoral studies on a self-financed basis due to a lack of quota.

In 2022, 17 new research themes have been adopted.

For the third time in 2022, the KDI has launched **a scholarship competition for** doctoral students with the explicit aim of providing financial support for quality publications and conference participation. Thanks to this call, a total of 7 doctoral students have received financial support this year.

2.2 KDI events, activities, international cooperation

Events in 2022 include:

- complex examinations (January and June 2022), during which a total of 24 second-year doctoral student gave an account of his or her knowledge,
- the online research forum (by research area) in January and June 2022,
- In May 2022, Cleopatra Charles, Associate Professor at Rutgers University in the US, has agreed to teach an 'Academic Writing Seminar',
- In September 2022, Radka Bartonickova, the coordinator of the Graduate School of the Faculty of Economics and Administration of the University of Pardubice, will visit the Graduate School in the framework of a "Staff exchange",
- In November 2022, Marina Ten, coordinator of the Jagellonian University Doctoral School in the Social Sciences, will visit the doctoral school as part of a "Staff exchange",
- the November 2022 Complex Examination Preparatory,
- In November 2022, a 'Workshop for PhD Students Research topics about Africa' was held, where two visiting students from the University of Perugia presented. Associate professors Dr. Viktor Marsai and Dr. Szabolcs Pásztor were actively involved in the workshop.
- In the autumn semester of the academic year 2022/2023, the doctoral school was involved in two international projects: (1) the development of a Blended Intensive Programme between Polish and Hungarian universities, (2) the development of an Erasmus cooperation between the German partner HS Kehl University and the Ethiopian Mizan-Tepi University, the Ethiopian Civil Service University and Jigjiga University.

2.3 Terms of operation of the KDI

From an operational point of view, it should be highlighted that the MAB accredited the KDI until 31 October 2023 by its Decision 2018/9/VII/8/2/1226.

The KDI is technically operational. The KDI is integrated into the infrastructure system of the NUAS.

The KDI website is constantly updated, and the data provide sufficient information for doctoral students at the same time, Neptun is the primary form of contact with doctoral students.

3 Future tasks of the Doctoral School of Public Administration

- a) encouraging quality publications and conference participation by doctoral students (a) continuation of the publication grant launched in 2020)
- b) more intensive promotion of education at Sapientia University of Transylvania to have Transylvanian doctoral students in 2023
- c) a stronger enforcement of the training requirements system; a closer monitoring of the academic progress of doctoral students with a stronger involvement of the supervisors
- d) expanding the KDI's domestic and international contacts (the national doctoral conference planned for April 2023 and the continuation of the international projects mentioned in section 2.2 will provide an excellent opportunity for the former)
- e) strengthening the international character of English language training, promoting it in a domestic context
- f) encouraging participation in study visits
- g) scheduling classes on the same day of the week (Thursday), as in other universities
- h) regulation of the online conduct of doctoral activities
- i) preparing for accreditation in autumn 2023
